



His family is his crown and joy. He provides for us and meets all of our needs, both physically and emotionally. He cares deeply for me and for all of our children. I am so blessed.





4H shows, and anything else big in their lives.


We also have an aunt and cousins that live out of state. One of the cousins was adopted and is a grown man now. He is a doctor, and is married with his own family.




